

# Republic of Texas 1836

(with some current United States cities inserted)

The 1836 boundaries of the Republic extended into present-day New Mexico, Colorado, Wyoming, Kansas, and Oklahoma. Texas was bounded on the west by the Rio Grande River extending to the headwaters, then due north to the 42<sup>nd</sup> parallel. The northern boundary extended along the 42<sup>nd</sup> parallel, then due south to the headwaters of the Arkansas River, which it followed to the 100<sup>th</sup> meridian, following it to the Red River. The northeastern, eastern, and southern boundaries, delineated by the Red River, the Sabine River, and the Gulf of Mexico, were just as they are in present-day Texas.
